THE NEW PRESIDENT : As reported at the beginning of the edition, the newly elected President of this Club is CYRIL MC DONALD.

We present a brief biography of Cyril to acquaint new members with his history, and to refresh the memory of older members.

CYRIL MC DONALD

The Northern Territory in 1944 was not held in high esteem by the 'Mexicans' (Oz citizens living South of the Border). To many it was the end of the world. Heroic Servicemen, champing at the bit in their anxiety to grapple with the enemy to the North were known to cringe in fear when a posting to Darwin was announced. In fact, such a posting became a punishment for malefactors!

To a young Vic/Railwayman, still wearing the marks of his apprenticeship, a posting 'on loan', to the Commonwealth Railways at the fly-blown, dust-laden town of Katherine must have carried its own share of trauma, if not terror.

His worst fears were confirmed. He was called upon to work in appalling conditions in a make-shift workshop with daily shifts extending for 16 to 18 hours at a stretch.

Mercifully, the stint of duty was not long so the victim, CYRIL MC DONALD, was able to survive with his sanity more or less intact!

Cyril was the elder of two sons born in Cohuna where his father was a Water Bailiff. Along with fellow-Probian, JIM AITKEN, he gained his Primary education at Mologa State School. For his Secondary education, he attended the West Melbourne Technical College.

In January, 1939 he commenced an apprenticeship with the Victorian Railways at Newport, transferring to Bendigo in April, 1941. Here he remained until 1960 (with the exception of the short, but painful experience outlined above).

In April 1960 he left the Railways to take up a position as Inspector with the Transport Regulation Board in Bendigo. Here his Technical experience enabled him to accept the responsibilit for inspecting and enforcing the safety regulations on all buse and taxis as his main duties.

Transferring to Warrnambool in 1972 he was appointed Regional Officer for the area. Here he remained until his retirement in 1983.

Cyril has always been heavily involved in sport, playing competitive football, cricket and tennis and now green bowls. Gardening and motoring fill in the spare corners of his retired life. He is the current Secretary of the Victorian Division of the Sportsmen's Association of Australia and a member of the National Executive.

Married in 1950 and with two children, Cyril was a Foundation member of the Probus Club of Warrnambool, which he joined in March, 1984.

Most importantly, Cyril McDonald is now PRESIDENT of the PROBUS CLUB OF BENDIGO!
