PROBUS CLUB OF BENDIGO - 10 YEARS - TRIPS 1985 TO 1995

On foundation of the Probus Club of Bendigo in 1985 I was entrusted with the position of Tours Organiser and this has been my speciality for a continuous period of ten years, a responsibility which I have enjoyed.

Trips and outings are one of the lifelines of Probus; we have travelled locally, within Victoria, Interstate and Overseas, have travelled over land, on the water and in the air. We have travelled by Coach, Rail and Airplanes, have experienced the wonders of nature: scenery, plants and native fauna with which both our State and Australia abounds.

We have been on top of mountains, down mines, been in lush tropical and rain-forests and to arid areas. We have sampled the delights of both our own and foreign foods, sampled a great variety of Australian Wines, and some cheese, attended live shows, T.V. shows, theatre restaurant, visited radio and newspaper establishments.

We have visited some of the most beautiful gardens in Victoria at Macedon, The Rhododendron Gardens, a Tulip Farm and visited Ballarat Begonia Festival, Garden World was a delight.

Our industrial visits have included Railways, S.E.C., Motor Car Manufacturers, Textiles, Ceramics, Potteries, Rice Mills, Dairy Products, Food Processing and Fruit Canneries.

Over the years visits were made to a variety of Wineries and Wine Cellars both in Victoria and Interstate, providing many pleasant wine tasting experiences.

Farming visits have included Sheep Stud Farms, Tomato growing, Citrus Growing and the Riverina Field Day at Boonoke.

The trips have included many heritage attractions, the fully restored old homes of Monte Christo at Junee and Nooralim at Murchison. The Rural Museum at Temora was excellent, covering a wide ranging cross section of our early days. Knowledge of how Parliament functions at both State and Federal levels was gained during visits to Melbourne and Canberra, at each of which we visited both Upper and Lower Houses whilst Parliament was in session.

We have now participated in 104 organised trips and outings of varying durations and great variety. A check of records indicated our 100th trip was the "Trip of The Year" Wagga/Canberra/ Riverina, from September 18th to 24th, 1994. The Combined Probus Picnic on March 17th will be our 105th. Organised trips have taken the hassle out of travel, presented the opportunity to visit attractions we otherwise would not have visited, to make new friends and to share in the enjoyment of new experiences.

Highlights over the 10 year period include: Singapore and Hong Kong, Expo in Brisbane, The Snowy Mountains, Tall Ships for the Bicentenial, The Famous Flying Scotsman and Riverina Field Day at Boonoke.

There have been nine major "Trips of the Year" of approximately one week or more duration, nine trips of 2/3 day duration, the remainder being shared by trips/outings of one day and a few of 1/2 day.

The success of the trips are due to Probians caring and sharing, our Collectors of Trips monies, Treasurers and Secretaries, Editors of "Probe" past and present, our "Chief Badger" and to our travellers who over the years have maintained constant support for scheduled trips. "Thanks to all".

A point of interest, over the 10 year period, monies paid in for Trips would aggregate approximately \$100,000.00.
