PROFILE OF OUR PRESIDENT - KEVIN HOULAHAN



Kevin was born on 20th April 1921, the youngest of seven children (4 brothers and 2 sisters), with all but one still living. His education started at the Eppalock State School and then at Assumption College, Kilmore. The Education Department was his first employer being a student teacher before entering the Melbourne Teachers College in 1941.

He then entered the Army doing elementary training at Balcombe and subsequently joined the 4th Armoured Regiment. Some months later, after attending a school at the Tank Wireless Wing of the Armoured Fighting Vehicles School at Puckapunyal he was transferred there as an instructor for a couple of years before enlisting in the RAAF. After training in Adelaide and Point Cook as a Cypher Assistant he sailed to Moratai where he remained until December 1945.

In 1946 he married Theresa Mannes resulting in 5 daughters. Subsequently 5 sons-in-law came along and now there are 14 grandchildren.

In 1947 he resigned from the Education Department and started with his brother and uncle in the Building Industry in Melbourne. In early 1955 he and his brother were engaged in the construction of the Sunset Drive-In Theatre in Maribyrnong and became interested in establishing one in Bendigo. It was agreed that Kevin would transfer back to Bendigo and be responsible for the establishment of this theatre. This operated for about 30 years until videos presented a more popular medium for film exhibition.

In 1965 he was associated with a company that had the lease of the Plaza cinema in Bendigo and had operated satisfactorily until it was decided to build the "Twin Cinemas" in Queen Street in 1975. After about 12 years the cinema was sold to a group from Shepparton who, together with Roadshow, have built an extra cinema and intend, very soon, to extend further. Kevin has been busy in the broader community since returning to Bendigo having spent some time with Legacy, Strathfieldsaye Council, Bendigo Sewerage Authority, Lake Eppalock Foreshore Committee, Northern District School of Nursing, Bendigo Base Hospital Board, Mount Alvernia Board and National Trustees Ltd.

He greatly appreciates the work which so many people in the community contribute to make Bendigo such a great place to live.
