### VISIT TO B.R.I.T. SALEYARDS CAMPUS

It was in 1993, following recommendations from the Victorian Government that facilities be developed to meet the requirements of Vocational Education Training, that the former Bendigo Saleyards was chosen as the site for a new B.R.I.T. Campus.

On 16/3/2000 members of our Club, through the courtesy of Graeme Trewartha, son of member Ted, were given the opportunity to inspect the transformation scene which is now well advanced.

We met at the Campus Canteen and, while enjoying a cuppa, Graeme, with the aid of a contoured plan, explained the processes of converting the site for present and future development following its reclamation and decontamination to meet E.P.A. Certificate standards.

Our comprehensive excursion began at the Horticultural Centre which was officially opened in 1997 and will feature an orchard, vineyard and landscaping of the site to provide practical experience for the students.

In early 1998 Automotive and Rural Studies moved into the 3,500 sq. metre rockface building, while existing buildings, including the old pig shed, are used for storage and machinery.

The Building Construction complex with Carpentry, Joinery, Painting and Decorating and every detail of Plumbing, including a sand pit, and yes, with official approval, you can have a unit built to your design and specifications. This complex, together with Engineering, was completed in December 1999. The Engineering building accommodates the Fitting and Machine shop, Metal Fabrication and lecture rooms.

Buildings are very well designed and equipped for their intended purpose with the installation of dust and fume extractors where necessary to serve work areas.

Local contractors were employed for the construction of these "state of the art" upgraded buildings and facilities covering the whole spectrum of training from the use of basic trade tools to modern, sophisticated computer controlled machines.

Students and staff have moved from archaic, out-date buildings to the most modern available.

The head of each department was in attendance to answer questions and give a detailed explanation of his particular operation.

The State Government has recently confirmed that funding of an additional \$1.5 million will be made available later in 2000 for the construction of a new Electronics building along with a Student Union building which will house a Library, toilets, canteen and student recreational area. This Stage Four announcement brings the total funding invested in the new Industry Training Centre, Saleyards Complex, since 1997, to over \$15 million.

At the conclusion of our excursion President Alan thanked Graeme for organising and conducting a very enlightening and interesting tour of inspection and made the traditional Probus presentation on behalf of the members.

Congratulations Graeme on what you have achieved in directing the development of a project which is a great asset to the Bendigo Regional Institute of T.A.F.E. and to the City of Bendigo and the region it serves.
