NEW MEMBER

Bill Redmond introduced Kenneth Crouch to the members and the following is his summary. Kenneth Frederick Crouch

Born 19th July, 1940 at Mildura.

Dad joined the Army soon after, and we moved to Melbourne, living at Glenroy. I was educated at the Essendon Technical College, and we later moved to Sea Lake in the Mallee. Dad had farmed in the Mallee in his younger days.

At 16 years of age I learned shearing, and shore sheep in the Wimmera and Mallee. I later did general farm work, clover harvesting, driving as a shop assistant around Sea Lake, which was a lovely country town in those days, but like most places now has a reduced population and prosperity. When I was 19 I got sprung for speeding up the main street of Sea Lake in Dad's Mercury one Saturday morning and decided the police force sounded a bit exciting, so when they next had a recruiting drive in country areas, as they did in those days, I applied and was accepted. I was stationed at Fitzroy, later Victoria Dock, the Surveillance Branch, Ringwood CIB and the Fraud Squad before promotion to Sergeant. I worked in the inner suburbs then Ringwood as a Sergeant, before returning to the CIB where I worked in the Armed Robbery Squad and the Surveillance Section of the Bureau of Criminal Intelligence. I later transferred to Bendigo as a Senior Sergeant, deputy to Adrian Booth. After 2 years I transferred to Highway Patrol, our area being Bendigo, Mildura, Swan Hill, Echuca and Shepparton, After two years of that I returned to the Station as Officer-In-Charge for 7 1/2 years, then the District Support Group doing drugs, firearms and licensing and Support Services with the DSG, D24, Prosecutors, Neighbourhood Watch, District Firearms, Radio Electronics, Intelligence Officer, Crime Collator's Officer, Computer Officer and the Community Policing Squad, until retirement on 4th July (Independence Day) 1997.

I married a Sea Lake girl, Margaret McLean, in 1962 and we had 3 children, Caroline, Andrew and Danny. The boys are in the Dog Squad and at Fawkner respectively, and Caroline's husband is in the Purana Task Force. Caroline is in Childcare. To my great sorrow, Margaret died several years ago.

I have a 1923 Durant car, which I am very slowly restoring, I feel a bit embarrassed by my slow work on this project. I played football for Sea Lake in my youth and with some amateur teams in Melbourne while there, but only dabbled in sports in recent years.

Ken was inducted into our club by President John.
