The guest speaker at today's meeting is Mr. Peter Heider who will speak on the Seeing Eye Dogs.



At last month's meeting the guest speaker was Terry Davidson who spoke on the Internet with the aid of practical demonstrations on his computer equipment. Terry was introduced by Arthur Cowling.

Terry has been involved with education for most of his working life, particularly with the blind in Australia and America. He has a B. Sc. from Melbourne, a Dip. Ed. from Monash and a M. Ed. from the University of Virginia, U.S.A. From 1992 to 1998 Terry worked at the Anne Caudle Centre as the Recreational Volunteer Coordinator and, since then, has set up his own business in Bendigo called Easi-

Net Services. He has no formal computer training but does not provide education or technical advice.

Terry's interest is with the Internet and in his talks to older people has found that the general attitude was that "I am too old for that, leave it to my grandchildren". This is a great shame, according to Terry, as there is so much of value, so much information on the Internet and it is a pity that people are missing out on it.

The purpose of Terry's visit today is twofold. He has commenced his new business and wants to introduce people to that and secondly, to combat some of the bad publicity which has emanated from the media recently with regard to bombmaking, pornographic and hate sites as these are only a very small percentage of the informative sites that are available.

Terry's portable equipment consists of a laptop computer, an extra display monitor, a small colour printer and two speakers to provide more volume for a group session. As not all in the room would be able to see the screen clearly the demonstration would be structured around access to sound files as well as visual files. Access to the Internet depends on a telephone connection to a Service Provider who, in turn, provides a connection to thousands of computers around the world which store hundreds of millions of documents that are available to be searched for information relevant to an enquiry, all this for the cost of a local call.

Terry then proceeded to access sites which provide the anthems of all countries to the B.B.C. news service. He also demonstrated the telephone directories of Australia and America and accessed the newspapers of the world, including The Bendigo Advertiser. Other sites included music and information on Probus Clubs worldwide. Genealogy, hobbies, sport and chat groups are other areas in which the Internet can be used.

Another use of the Internet is a mailing, or correspondence service called E.Mail which enables printed messages, voice messages and even video clips to be sent to any other E.Mail user in the world; again for the cost of a local telephone call.

Much interest was generated among the members present with many relevant questions. Terry was thanked by Rupert Reynolds for his very interesting talk and demonstrations and he presented him with the usual Probus mug.
