THE BENDIGO WINE INDUSTRY

Herb Hesse introduced the speaker at the July meeting - Wes Vine proprietor of the Mandurang Valley Winery. Wes started his career as a Primary School Teacher, becoming a Principal eventually. Having taken a B. A. and a Diploma in Agriculture he started wine making, for personal consumption at first, then expanded to become a producer to the public in general. He is now in his third year as president of the Bendigo Wine Growers Association.

According to one authority, David Dunston, 1854 was the start of the wine industry in Bendigo. The soil and the microclimate of Bendigo are very well suited to viticulture. Consequently the areas growing vines continued to expand. From 39 1/2 acres in 1859 the total area increased to 972 acres in 1880. The wine produced by these acres was good enough to win awards in Europe. It was the fixed intention of these pioneers to make the finest wines they could, and they succeeded in winning medals in Vienna 1873, Brussels in 1876, and Bordeaux in 1882.

This happy state of affair came sharply to an end in 1877 with the arrival of the Phylloxera Scourge in Geelong. Slowly but inexorably, helped by prevailing winds from the Southwest, Phyllocera found its way to almost all the scattered plantings.

In 1896 the Government gutted the industry, ordering the uprooting of vines. They followed this by banning the introduction of salicylic acid into wine at a preservative. As a result of this the wineries were forced to sacrifice thousands of gallons of wine by pouring it down the creeks.

It took 70 years for Bendigo to rise again, due to the efforts of Ron Andrews, Stuart Anderson, Tom Connor and others. Production resumed and the quality was as good as ever. The rest of the world took its time to appreciate this but now Europe, including the U.K and America import Australian wines on a large scale.

The Bendigo wine area now has 23 licensed wineries, mostly small producers say 40-50 tonnes of grapes annually. The big 4 of the industry buy up production. Prices of Bendigo wines are high because of the interest in keeping quality up, quantity is down. One winery in the region sends all its production to the USA where it goes for \$1500 a bottle.

Another factor in the price of wine is taxation, about 46% of the retail price. This is an encouragement to export, the tax on export is negligible. Wes predicts that winery Tourism has a big future.

After the talk, the presentation was made by Kevin Houlaham.

TREE PROJECT

In his closing remarks the President made a commercial plug for tree planting. He showed us the seedlings which are available, and the potting mix and literature which is attainable at the Bendigo Council depot in Golden Square.
