The Guest Speaker today is Ron Poyser who will talk about, "My Life in the Motor Industry for 25 years".

At the July meeting, the Guest Speaker was Mr Stephen Lindsay, the Urologist. He was introduced by President Bryan who gave us a brief account of Stephen's life and career. Stephen's special interest is prostate cancer.

It is normal for the prostate to grow with age irrespective of any abnormality. Prostate disease, though, is very common. Screening for prostate cancer is controversial as to effectioness, and is expensive. The cancer is slow in developing, maybe 8 to 10 years, which is not conductive to diagnosis. Over the next 4 years there may be some clarity in the procedure.

As for the actual procedure in testing there are two means. First, internal examination which is not pleasant, but is useful. Alternatively a blood test may be used, Prostate specific antigen (P.S.A.) is not cancer specific but may indicate cancer as one possibility.

As with most conditions, early detection may mean that a cure is possible. Surgery may be used but there are non-invasive treatments which may be successful, for instance Radio-therapy or Hormone treatment. The male hormones encourage the growth of the cancer, and this may be reversed by monthly injections of female hormones.

The Alfred Hospital and the Peter McCallum centre have available the scheme for permanent implants of radio active iodine and this will soon be available at the St. John of God Hospital in Bendigo.

After the talk Bruce Michelsen expressed the tanks to the members, and made the usual presentation.
