A Special General Meeting is held every 3rd. Wednesday each month at 10.00 a.m. at the Bendigo Club.

The Guest Speaker at today's Meeting is MAX GRIERSON, B.A., T.S.T.C., S.A.T.C. Max is Head of the Faculty of Arts at Caulfield Grammar School, and has 29 years of teaching experience. He is the son of our well-known member ALF GRIERSON.

The title of his talk is "Education - Better or Worse".

We also have the name of the Speaker for the Meeting on March 18th., he is GRAEME TREWARTHA, Regional Manager, Northern Region, Regional Development Agency, Department of Manufacturing & Industry Development speaking on "What's Developing in Bendigo".

Our Speaker at the January Meeting was one of our own members, WALTER ASHBURN, whose subject was "Observations Abroad". After an introduction by RAY FITZCERALD, we were given Walter's mpressions of many countries, some briefly, some at greater length. In England he saw a quarry started by the Romans, and still working. In Stockholm a warship which capsized 300 years ago which has been raised intact. The capsizing was because of the number of cannon on the gun deck. In neighbouring Norway, Walter was amazed to find that one area has only 16 inches annual rainfall, and farming is only possible by the aid of irrigation. Norwegian farmers are encouraged to stay on the land by generous subsidies in, for instance, education. Power lines have been put in to power the farms in remote areas, sometimes needing the help of helicopters when the terrain is impenetrable. Still on farming, Walter discovered that in Britain production levels are so high, that there is a nett export of wheat. Further south, a new motorway has been built which cuts the travelling time from Nice to Florence from $2\frac{1}{2}$ days to $4\frac{1}{2}$ hours. The cost of construction was A\$13 million

per mile. The chief financier was the Vatican, and they draw revenue from tolls.

Besides these points Walter had much to tell us about Switzerland, Ireland, Scotland, Singapore and other places. If Walter did not keep a detailed journal of his activities he must have a phenomenal memory. LEN HALL thanked Walter on behalf of Problems, and made the usual presentation.

JOHN RUSSEL (PETER) GOODRICH

Born at Murrumbeena in Melbourne on 19th. May, 1925, Peter was educated at Oakleigh Primary School, Murrumbeena P.S., Tooronga Road Central School, and Melbourne Boys High, before being employed by the P.M.G. as a telphonist. In 1942 he joined the R.A.A.F. and after training in Sydney and Melbourne as a Wireless Mechanic he saw service at Madang in New Guinea before returning to the P.M.G. in 1946. He then accepted full time study for Matriculation, under the Rehabilitation Training Scheme, and after being promoted to Assessor with the Taxation Department, decided in 1949 to marry the young lady who spent a lot of her spare time riding around on the pillion seat of his A.J.S. motor cycle, and he's happy to say that, though the motor bike was soon sold, they are still happily together.

After due consideration, Peter decided to leave the Commonwealth Public Service and become a Primary Teacher and after 12 months training, during which time their elder daughter was born, he was appointed to Creek View State School near Elmore. After two years there he transferred to Wickliffe, south of Ararat, where their second daughter was born, before coming to Bagshot where he was Head Teacher for 5 years.

After transfering to Flora Hill Primary School in 1961, he was promoted to the Bendigo North Rural Training School where he train Teachers College students in the intricate art of conducting a one teacher rural school. After 4 years there he transferred to Quarry Hill P.A. where he had large classes of up to 48 children for the next 3 years, before being seconded to the Bendigo Teachers College to lecture on the use of audio-visual equipment in the classroom.

At 49 years of age Peter was appointed Principal of East Loddon and was heavily involved in the conversion of that school to one of the first P 12 schools in the state.

His next position was Principal of Bendigo North Primary School where he saw the complete rebuilding of the facility into a coreplus, prior to his retirement in 1986.

Peter has always preferred to play sport rather than watch it, and has been involved in tennis, cricket, golf and bowls, with varying success.

During 1965 he was Master of Campaspe Lodge in Elmore and fr 1986 was for three years the Foundation President of Heartbeat Victoria - Bendigo, a support group for people who have had open heart surgery or other serious heart problems.

Finally he is proud to be a Foundation Member of Bendigo Probus Club.
