A Special General Meeting is held every 3rd Wednesday each month at 10.00 a.m. at the Masonic Centre, McIvor Road.

The guest speaker at today's meeting is Mr. Ern Bell who will speak on the Masonic Institution.

For the first meeting of 1997, our guest speaker was Mr. Hugh Mason, Engineer/Designer of Roxby Downs township and previously Shire Engineer for the Strathfieldsaye Shire Council.

A graduate of the Bendigo School Of Mines in Civil Engineering, Hugh was employed as Shire Engineer with several councils, not the least being Strathfieldsaye, where, amongst many other achievements, he coordinated the efforts of five local councils during the construction of the Bendigo airfield.

Hugh was also employed by Western Mining Corporation to build Roxby Downs township in South Australia to provide accommodation for the personnel manning the Roxby Downs mine and their families. This mine gives access to a massive ore body containing copper, gold, silver and uranium and has a working life of approximately 300 years.

Due to the isolation of the site, which is about 500kms north of Adelaide with very poor access roads, most early access was by air. Vegetation consisted mainly of mulga and native pine while the terrain was sand dunes. Commenced in 1986, the town is designed to accommodate 5000 to 6000 people and includes a \$7 million shopping/hotel/motel complex, a licensed club and 2 canteens to provide essentials of life while leisure time was catered for with swimming pool, tennis courts, sports ovals, golf course and 2

caravan parks. Some housing was transported from the South while others were built on site in temperatures, at times, in excess of 38 degrees centigrade. The South Australian market of instant grass was cornered as it was not practical to grow lawn from seed.

A limestone quarry 4kms away provided roadmaking materials; water was obtained from the artesian basin and power came from a feeder line from Port Augusta. The water was piped to a 4 megalitre plastic lined basin then passed through a desalination plant. The sewage system is evaporative and surplus water is recycled for watering purposes.

Hugh rounded off his talk with a few words on his time in New Guinea where he worked on the redevelopment of roads and airfield.
