The guest speaker for today's meeting is Mr. Ian Green who will speak on "The Big Stupa".



At our January meeting, our member, Cliff Binks gave us an insight into his early years and included his experiences over several trips to the United States of America. He was introduced by Bill Jacka who delivered a postage stamp summary of Cliff's life to date.

Cliff was born in Rochester and attended a number of Primary schools before completing his education at the Bendigo School of Mines where he obtained a Diploma of Civil Engineering. During the war he served in New Guinea as a lieutenant with an engineering unit. After the war he was employed by the State Rivers and Water Supply in Shepparton and Bendigo until his retirement in 1982. Cliff married Norma in 1946 and they have 4 children. Cliff is an historian, a member of the Genealogical Society, Friends of the Cemetery, Bendigo R.S.L., an active member of the Forest St. Uniting Church and a Foundation Member of the Bendigo Probus Club.

Cliff's first sea voyage was a trip to Cowes while on his honeymoon.

After his family had grown up, one of Cliff's daughters travelled to America and stayed there. This was the trigger for Cliff and Norma's frequent travels to that country. As Pauline lives mostly in Dallas, Cliff's comments are largely on that area and firstly centred on the churches that he had attended. The impressions gained were a mix of ostentation, modesty and security.

Transport in America is probably one of the key things as it is a big country with a lot of people to move around. To get a feel of the country Cliff and Norma travelled for 4 weeks on a Greyhound bus which landed them in some rather dubious areas. In driving Cliff was impressed by the courtesy of the drivers, particularly in Dallas.

The weather in Dallas ranges from 110 to -2 degrees F over the year with high humidity in the summer. Not the best for gardening.

The young people (under 21) of Dallas are subject to a curfew and no consumption of alcohol, while golf, football, baseball, ice skating, horse racing, tennis and snow sports are the major sports. Cliff saw no sign of bowls.

Cliff's further comments related to the Indians, crime and policing, security, firearms, and capital punishment.

Dell Martin thanked Cliff for his talk and made the usual presentation.

PROFILE OF WILLIAM STANLEY CLEMENS

Born in Kensington, Melbourne on 17th December, 1932, the only son, with three sisters, Bill and his family moved to Bendigo in 1941. He was educated at Quarry Hill Primary School and Bendigo Technical College before taking up a plumbing apprenticeship in 1946. Bill was then employed in the building trade until 1960 with some time spent as a plumbing instructor at Bendigo Prison.

In 1956 he married Janet Lawry and they have four children. Lorraine is a school teacher, Trevor, a fireman with the Melbourne Metropolitan Brigade, Ian is an optometrist with practices in Bendigo, Maryborough, Kyneton and Castlemaine and Colin who is a builder in Brisbane.

Bill joined the Police Force in 1960 and had service in Melbourne in various squads and at Collingwood, Richmond, Camberwell and the Mobile Traffic Section and Highway Patrol at Warrnambool. He retired in 1985 with the rank of Sergeant.

Since retirement, he has travelled extensively throughout Asia, New Zealand, Pacific Islands and states of Australia.

He has been involved with service clubs in Bendigo and various sports - cricket with Bendigo United, baseball with Scots, representative basketball for Bendigo, pennant golf for Bendigo and Eaglehawk Golf Clubs and started bowls in 1985 with Golden Square after back surgery prevented him from continuing with golf.

Bill is an active member of Essendon Football Club which occupies his weekends during the Footy season and has been a member of Bendigo Probus for 6 years and a Committee member for 3 years. What spare time Bill has left is devoted to his passion for collecting antique bottles from the Bendigo area from the 1880 to 1930 period.
