This month's guest speaker is Ken Briggs, former CEO of State Rivers, now back after working on the construction of dams and reservoirs in South Africa.

GUEST SPEAKER

The guest speaker at the January meeting was introduced by Bruce Perrin, he was Paul Kirkpatrick who is the CEO of the Peter Harcourt Centre and he spoke about the development of Harcourt Park.

Paul is a Bendigonian, born and bred, who has worked for some time in the field of health management. He was formerly a colleague of Bruce Perrin at the Base Hospital. Among his present activities he is chairman of Camp Getaway at Axedale.

He has been the CEO at the Peter Harcourt Centre for six years now, and one of his achievements is the supervision of the construction of the Harcourt Park facility. The Peter Harcourt Centre and Harcourt Park are named after the son of Sylvia Harcourt. Peter was killed in a car accident, and in his memory his mother endowed the centre.

The centre has a staff of fifty-five, who supervise the one hundred and ten occupants of the centre. The annual budget is usually approaching three million dollars. The organisation owns and runs the Watermark Paper Mill in Abel Street. Another activity is environmental services in which grass cutting and garden maintenance are involved. Besides these there are Calico Country in Williamson Street and the Terrace Print Service in Mollison Street.

Harcourt Park is a new venture. It is situated at Grassy Flat Creek on Crook Street between Gittens Drive and Crook Street. The park is an innovative project intended to forge relationships between people with a disability and the rest of the community. The aim is to provide the opportunity and a venue for these people to gain skills in agriculture and horticulture, and it is also planned to have a chook shed and a pigeon loft. Another future aim is to have a mini zoo with small domestic animals, maybe cattle and even

horses on adjistment. The community in general, and particularly schools will be invited to visit and perhaps participate. Harcourt Park is proudly supported by:
