Guest Speaker

John Cartwright was our guest speaker for January. He is a retired Optometrist, having practised in Bendigo for many years. To qualify as an optometrist today one must complete 7 years of study at Melbourne University. The eye is probably the most sophisticated and complex organ in the body.

With the aid of slides, John explained the structure and function of each part of the eye. We learnt how we see in the daylight and the dark, how we see colours, what is the blind spot, why and how we blink, why it is usually men that are colourblind and how cataracts are formed and removed. John gave information on diseases of the eye, like macular degeneration and the effect of diabetes and glaucoma.

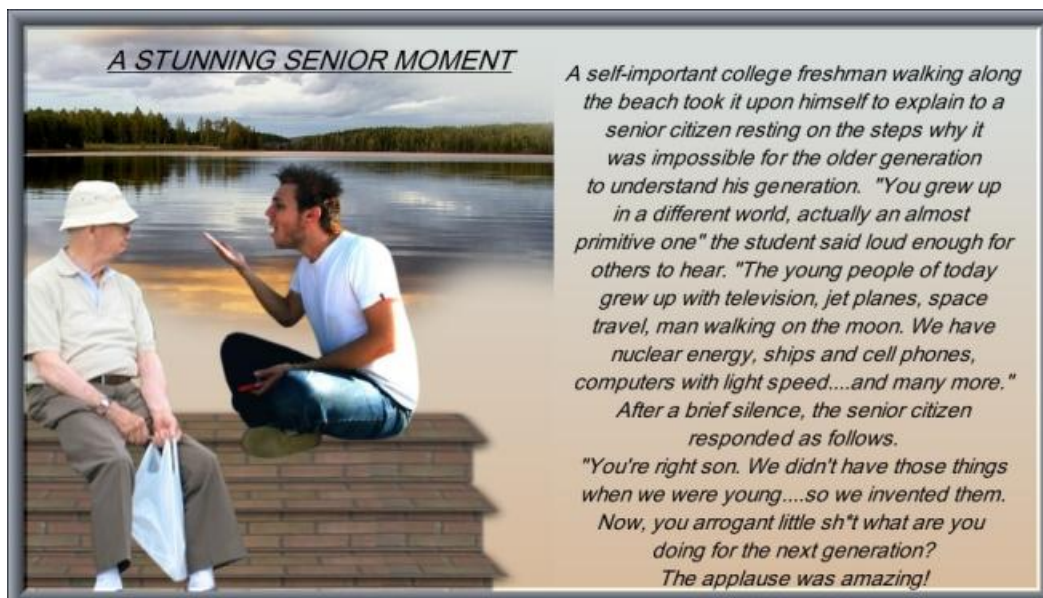

CONFIRMATION: The minutes of the preceding meeting were confirmed as distributed. Moved by the Act. Secretary, seconded by C. Adams, Carried.
