A Special General meeting is held every 3rd Wednesday of each month at 9.30am at the Masonic Centre, McIvor Road, Bendigo.

The Guest Speaker for the January meeting is Paul Kirkpatrick, CEO of the Peter Harcourt Centre, whose subject will be the development of Peter Harcourt Park.

## GUEST SPEAKER

At the November meeting Brian Clemson introduced Geoff Mitchell who is CEO of Coliban Water. Geoff went into water distribution and quality improvement on completing his course at the BIT.

In his talk Geoff overwhelmed us with huge numbers. The Coliban Water complex covers 16,500 square kilometers and includes 8 major water storages and 19 other reservoirs and dams, but does not include Lake Eppalock. The running costs for the complex is \$10 million a year. Currently there are projects under way to the value of \$200 million.

Of the new projects a water treatment facility in Castlemaine came on line in the middle of last year. A waste water treatment plant was developed in Kyneton which discharges partially into streams. A similar situation applies in Bendigo with discharge into Bendigo Creek. Some of the dams in the system are 90 to 100 years old and updating is going on. Water treatment plants in Echuca and Bendigo among others are being upgraded.

Geoff showed us some of the devices used for micro-filtration, perhaps the newest such system. It uses fine hollow polythene fibres with very fine holes in the surface. The water comes on the outside of the fibres, is forced through the fine holes into the hollow and flows on, leaving solid particles still outside. The fibres are made up into modules and the modules are assembled into the banks 1-2 metres long. The elements have a working life of 3-5 years. This technology was developed in Australia and is exported all over the world. To remove the taste and odour in the water it is carbon filtered and processed with ozone, a technique developed by French engineers.

Alan Court made the usual presentation.


\*\* Use own cars. Report at Pottery 9.00am




