This great event has been awarded to Bendigo and will take place from 29th November to 4th December. On November 29th, the visitors will be installed in residence at the Student Accompdation for Latrobe University Bendigo Campus in Retreat Road.

The competitions will number 1000 approximately, and there will be also the officials,

team managers and so on.

The participants will arrive from all over the Commonwealth countries in Europe,

Asia, Africa and America; and of course Australasia.

There will be 10 sports to be seen, not simply track and field athletics, but boxing, badminton, rugby 7's and so on. All these sports will need controlling officials, starters, judges, umpires, recorders, timing officials etc.

The organisers are calling for 1000 volunteers, for the games offices, ticket sales, transport and so on. These people will have introductory instruction for what they have

to do, and will be given uniforms and official badges.

Besides the sporting activity, Bendigo itself will be on show, six days are available to show the World what this city has to offer. It is estimated that 2000 visitors will inject something like \$6,000,000 into the city's economy.

With bowls in recess for the winter, there are a few dates Bowlers may wish to enter in their diaries for the coming season, commencing with:



PROBUS CLUB OF BENDIGO - TRIPS INFORMATION

On Thursday 22nd April our Group of 18 consisting of Probians, wives and a friend of Probus departed at 8.45am from Crook Street for what proved to be a most enjoyable, interesting and informative local area tour. Our Coach Driver on this occasion was David Jackman of Bendigo Coach Lines.

First visit was to Confectionery Capers which is situated 10km from Bendigo on

the McIvor Highway.

Upon arrival at 9.00am we were cordially welcomed by Owner/Operator Campbell Smith who outlined the essentials of Confectionery Capers. The name is a Marketing Theme, although Iollies are in abundance, they are not the core of the operation which sets out to:

1. Challenge and make you think; 2. It emphasises the importance of the Humble Wheel (man's greatest invention), basic applied mechanics; 3. About the English language; 4. That Lollies are used as a Marketing Mode. The wheel is the most important component of the operation of this attraction.

The attraction was lively, creative, and imaginary, and most interesting, it is considered to be the only one of it type in the world. It was created, designed and

constructed by Campbell and been open for 10 years.

Our next visit was to Living Wings and Things (located near the Bendigo Pottery) where we were met by owner Peter Hamilton. Upon arrival we were served Tea/Coffee and biscuits, at the conclusion of which Peter conducted our Group on a tour of the attraction. The facility has: 60 varieties of colourful birds in 30 aviaries (of which 2 were large walk in aviaries), an indoor tropical enclosure housing some unusual plants with seasonal butterflies. The animals included dingoes, wallabies and possums and the Reptile House a collection of lizards, python snakes and a crocodile safely housed behind glass.

Peter possessed and infinite knowledge of the birds, animals and reptiles housed in the

facility and gave an interesting commentary throughout the tour.

Our final destination was to **the House of Khong** for a Chinese Smorgasbord Lunch consisting of a variety of tasty dishes of which you could eat as much as you so desired.

Summary: Those who travelled on the tour and visited Confectionery Capers & Wings & Living Things were surprised at the high quality and amount of interesting things at both of these local venues.

In short they deemed it to be a most interesting, informative and enjoyable outing with

great variety.

We have lunch in the bush with "billytea" After dinner Whimpey will show a Video Presentation "Whimpey's World - Little Desert Flora & Fauna" with particular focus on the Malley Fowl bird, (An excellent video.) Day 3: At 9.00am, after breakfast we depart for a tour of the Mallee Fowl Sanctuary, a protected habitat which provides a rare opportunity to see these mound building birds in the wild. A Light Lunch will be provided prior to our departure from the Lodge at 12 Noon.
