Thank you, this leaves us one member to be filled. Also we are still seeking a Guest Speaker Organiser.



James (Jim) Ray Aitken, Foundation Member and President in 1994.

Jim was born in Bendigo in 1925 and was raised on the family farm at Mologa Central, where he attended the local state school until he went to Bendigo High School. He commenced duty as a junior officer of the Courts Branch at the Geelong Court in 1942 where he was trained in the practice and procedure of all courts in the State's judicial system. He became a clerk of courts in various capacities, mainly in Geelong and the Melbourne City Court, and was appointed to the principal position in Geelong in 1967. He became a stipendiary magistrate in 1969 and sat in many courts throughout the State for the next 16 years, 11 years of which was in the Geelong and Western District



circuit, After residing in Geclong for 40 years, he transferred to Bendigo at the end of 1982 as the co-ordinating magistrate, until he retired in 1985. Since then he has been active as a volunteer, mostly for the Uniting Church, and was treasurer of the Bendigo Chaplaincy Committee for a decade. Jim married Jean Kelly of Geelong in 1952. She died in 1974, and they had one son, Richard. In 1979 Jim married Dorothy Clardge of Bendigo, whose husband Ron died in 1975. They had three sons - Bruce, lan and Noel. All the four sons have professional positions. Jim and Dorothy have four grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
