Hi Family & Friends, (both of you)

Again thanks for phone calls and emails. They are very much appreciated. Send another email or you may find us darkening your doorstep. The Cape York trip although a good experience, would have been have been better by far had we used our own vehicle, because the driver knows the consequences of failing to stop when Cynthia sees a photo opportunity. Five passengers joined the bus contingent after a boat trip from Cairns. With the balance we flew from Cairns making a total of fourteen passengers (all non smokers) with twenty four seats to spread out on. Our driver had the luxury of an \$11,000 truckie seat while we felt at times there was very little between the 4wd bus chassis and ours. Apart from the fact that our windows never opened and the door seldom did, we managed to enjoy a trouble free experience with a driver who had an incredible memory for both the early history of the region and the natural history.

For seven years our driver Steve was a trapeze artist with Circus Orlay. Then he survived but paid a high price for missing the net. Off season he captures and relocates troublesome crocs and snakes. Even so we were some what relieved one day when he failed to locate a Coastal Tiapan that took to long grass after striking at our moving bus. At the end of the trip we were given the usual Cape York Certificate quote "In recognition of your spirit of adventure, unfailing good humour and bravery in enduring the bone jarring track from Cairns with five million corrugations, pot holes, washouts, bull dust traps and sand bogs and in spite of crocodiles, mozzies, sand flies, green ants, snakes, wasps, blow flies and wild pigs, actually reached the most northern tip of mainland Australia". They overlooked including the couldn't care less barra fishermen doing the Cape in a weekend.

The main drag to the Cape is now a well constructed clay road suitable for 2wd vehicles, with long dust clouds from the sheer volume of traffic, the main worry. At the Top, Palm Cockatoos arrived late in the evening to feed on Beach Apricots. Conditions for images were difficult but we tried. Four of the six nights we had the luxury of en suites and palm shaded swimming pools. The other two nights we used shower - toilet units, station homesteads had trucked in and installed above wet season flood levels. OK for triathlon athletes, but demanding for grey nomads especially during the wee dark hours. Without a doubt, the most memorable aspect of the trip for us was meeting a wonderful person who amongst many achievements had climbed to a great height on the corporate ladder. A joy to be with. We are very pleased we spent time gaining images in Lakefield NP from our own vehicle prior to the bus trip. We felt that area offered the

best scenery for the trip. The Bloomfield section between Cooktown and Cape Tribulation was a good experience, but very rough and narrow and offering few places to park along the way.

We are presently north of Cairns for a few days at Ellis Beach giving bones and muscles a chance to reinstate themselves to where they are meant to be. With all day shade and a view through a line of beach front coconut palms to Double Island about 1.5 km away, life is good here. If we can cope with the sand flies we will probably spend a few days at Cape Tribulation and there decide our next direction. We are well and glad to be and trust you are the same.
