'GUEST' SPEAKER

The Guest Speaker today is Dorothy Crothers; the title of the talk 'Going to Court'.

At the May Meeting wives and friends were invited to attend, and there were three guests from the Strathfieldsaye Combined Probus Club.

The Guest Speaker, Councillor Barry Ackerman, former Mayor of Bendigo, was introduced by Maurice Pease, the subject of the talk was Development planned for the next 3 years.

In April, 1994 the population of Greater Bendigo was 85,000, with 71,000 voters. The recent restructuring of Local Government brought, among other advantages, an increase sum to devote to Capital Works. The operating revenue in total is \$58.15 million, 46% being raised from rates, and the total outlay on Capital Works is \$19.5 million.

The council is endeavouring to improve the image of the city by enhancing the streetscapes particularly at the entries to the city. Many other strategies are inplace, a marketing office has been set up in Melbourne, Trade Shows have been planned, a retail campaign devised to promote tourism, publicity for Art Gallery exhibitions and a web site at Bendigo Call Centre.

Developments are also taking place in other directions to make use of Bendigo's comparitive advantages, as a centre for the region's retail trades and financial and marketing services.

Capital works for the future are development of the White Hills Botanical Gardens; Charing Cross; Indoor Sports Centres; Sir John Quick Museum, upgrading Bendigo Regional Arts Centre with possibly a new theatre behind; and land development at the Airport.

The Council has a number of ideas in a wish list for the more distant future, completion of the Calder Highway, fast train service to Melbourne and as a major service provider for Northern Victoria. Above all to make Bendigo an attractive place to live, work and visit.

Clark Jeffrey very ably expressed the thanks and appreciation of the meeting, and made the usual presentation.
