A historical document for our Probus Club:

ROTARY CLUBS OF BENDIGO DISTRICT PROBUS PLANNING COMMITTEE. DATED 31MAY 1985

It is my pleasure as Convenor of the Probus Planning Committee to briefly report on the successful establishment of the first Probus Club in the Bendigo District on the 20th. March 1985.

As stated by one Club President, the tremendous response from retired and semi-retired professional and business men was indicative of the genuine need in the community for such a club.

The concept of forming a Probus Club· resulted from the challenge issued at the 980 District Assembly held in May, 1984. Several Rotarians returned from the conference completely sold on the idea" and considered the time was now right to launch such a project in Bendigo. Because of the significance, importance and magnitude of the venture, it was considered appropriate that the project should be undertaken as a joint effort by the five Rotary Clubs in the Bendigo region. With hindsight this was clearly the correct action. I am sure success was assured from the outset because of the enthusiastic manner which all Club Presidents and their Rotary Clubs accepted the idea and gave their whole hearted support.

Following the sanction of the five Rotary Club Presidents for the proposal to proceed, preliminary discussions were held with the Melbourne Probus Club Committee Chairman, Mr John Morgan in October, 1984. A Probus Club Planning Committee was formed in November comprising:-

Rotarians: Allan Johnson - Bendigo Strathdale; Ray Downey - Bendigo; Joe Niles - Eaglehawk, Bill Roberts - Kangaroo Flat; Ken Briggs - Bendigo South

Rotarian Reg Brock also played an active part when deputising for Ray Downey. Club Presidents also contributed to Committee Meetings on various occasions.

The success in launching this project was largely attributable to the enthusiasm, time and effort given to the detailed planning by this very dedicated Committee. While each member pulled his weight magnificently and we were able to use their various talents accordingly, I believe it is appropriate and would be the wish of the other Committee members to make special mention of the sterling effort made by Secretary/Treasurer, Allan Johnson. His attention to detail, willingness to carry out the difficult tasks and produce work of the highest standard, was admirable.

The Planning Committee were involved in a considerable number of meetings to investigate suitable venues, design letter heads, draft letters of introduction, prepare invitation cards and organise lists of prospective members etc.. One hundred and seventy invitations were sent out and 130 replies received back. Of that number 95 indicated that they would either attend the Foundation Meeting or were interested to join at a future time.

The Planning Committee was delighted with the overwhelming response when 74 men attended the meeting held on the 20th. March, 1984. A brief address was given by the Convenor of the Planning Committee on the history of the Probus Movement, its aims, objectives and activities. Guest speaker; Mr Frank Lowery, Past President of the Probus Club of Maryborough spoke on the subject of 'Probus in Action', and outlined his experience in the formation of a number of other Probus Clubs in the State of Victoria. Following question time, resolutions to form the Probus Club of Bendigo and accept applications for Foundation Membership were made, the constitution was adopted and four members of the Management Committee were elected.

The Presidents' Collar was presented by Mr Lowery on behalf of Rotary. The annual subscriptions of \$15 + \$5.00 initial membership were fixed. The proposed venue for future meetings is the Bendigo Club and meetings are to be held on the 3rd. Wednesday of each month. The five Rotary Clubs accepted the responsibility of sharing the expenses involved in establishing the Probus Club on an agreed pro-rata basis. The original budget estimate of \$300 was exceeded, the final amount being \$570.12. Financial statements are attached. All clubs honoured their commitment recognising that financial involvement rose proportinately with the increased numbers; which exceeded all expectations. The first Probus Club of Bendigo commenced with eighty Foundation Members which I understand is close to being a record in Australia. I can only conclude by expressing the appreciation of the Planning Committee to yourself and the other Club Presidents in offering your total support and encouragement in this venture which was considered initially a rather awe inspiring task. As Convenor, my personal thanks also go to the Planning Committee with whom it has been my pleasure to be associated. Would you please convey my appreciation to your Club Representative Alan Johnson for his enthusiastic and valuable contribution.

The Probus Club has already conducted several meetings which 1 understand have been an outstanding success. I am quite sure that under the competent leadership of Ray Downey this will continue and we wish them all success in the future.
