VALE CYRIL McDONALD

This month we are without a President. As we all know, Cyril McDonald collapsed and died while playing bowls. Our sympathy is extended to Del and the rest of Cyril's family, in their loss. Bendigo Probus Club has lost an esteemed leader and member.

As today's meeting is the Annual General Meeting we do not have a guest speaker, since the business to be transacted is longer than usual. Instead we will have a talk from our new member, Rupert Reynolds, who will give some anectdotes from his very varied and interesting career.

At the last February Meeting, the Guest Speaker was Ken Briggs, who talked to us about the construction of the Dartmouth Dam.

Ken was introduced by Ray Downey who told us that Ken had a career of 44 years in the Water Supply industry and was now the General Manager for the Loddon-Coliban Region. Also, from his close association with the Rotary Movement, Ken was instrumental in organising the foundation of the Bendigo Probus Club in 1984-85.

The talk was organised into two parts, first the process of planning and construction of the dam, and then two films which were made during the construction.

The name of the dam was taken from the nearby old mining town, called Dartmouth. The construction was put into the hands of Theiss Brothers, the cost being shared by the Federal Government and the three states, Victoria, South Australia and New South Wales. The main purpose of the dam is storage, with a supplementary role of generating hydro- electric power to cope with peak demand under the control of Mount Beauty.

A further purpose is the control of salinity on the Murray, the water being of high quality of purity. Besides these reasons there is also Flood Control in the Mitta Valley and the Tourist

potential.

Detailed preliminary investigations were made, examining the topology, hydrology, geology as well as the ecological and environmental effects. Following this detailed designs and specifications were made, tenders were called and Theiss Brothers selected as the contractors.

A first step for the project was building a 24 kilometre highway with concrete bridges, then the town to accommodate the construction workers, a force of 1,200 men. The dam is earth and rock filled, with an impervious clay core. The foundations had to be made impervious also by grouting to a depth of 60 metres. The finished dam is 180 metres high and 30 million tonnes in weight and is the largest in the Southern Hemisphere, with a storage volume of 14.1 million cubic metres and a surface area of 62 square kilometres.
