REPORT: TRIP TO INTERNATIONAL FLOWER and GARDEN SHOW, THURS, 3RD APRIL 2003

A group of 45, comprising 12 members of Bendigo Probus Club, with 4 of their friends, together with 29 members of Sandhurst Probus participated in this outing. (On this occasion Sandhurst Probus Club organized the trip.) Following departure at 7.30am we travelled through to Taylor's Lakes where we had a morning "Cuppa" at McDonalds.

We arrived at the Melbourne Exhibition & Carlton Gardens, the location of this International Spectacular and one of the world's great horticultural events, at approximately 10.00am. On entry were given an Official program & Guide in order to find our way around the multitude of exhibits located over a vast area.

Exhibits were brilliant, of wide ranging variety and they showcased the best Australia has to offer in the way of plant and flower growers, landscapers and florists. Both the inside of the Exhibition Building and the adjacent Carlton gardens were packed with a kaleidoscope of colour.

While the show exists primarily to inspire gardeners and lovers of plants, it is also an event for designers, nurseries and florists to show their talents. There were large numbers of garden experts on hand and among them were some of the well known T.V. gardening Presenters, and best of all they were eager to share information. Two Bendigo Nurseries were on display, McDonalds and Robbins.

The show presented a great opportunity for our "keen gardeners" to learn of the new varieties of plants and flowers which are available and garden techniques. There was an abundance of bulbs and plants available for sale.

After an enjoyable and informative day we departed for home at 3.30pm and arrived in Bendigo on time at 5.45pm. We enjoyed meeting with and sharing the outing with our Sandhurst friends.
