Today's Guest Speaker is Allen Howlett of the Vision Australian Foundation who will be talking about "Stay on your feet"

Last meeting's Guest Speaker was Anne Sanderson, who was introduced by Colin McLean. Her subject was The Red Cross. The Red Cross organisation owes its start to the accidental presence of a young Swiss banker, Henri Dunant on the battlefield of Solferino in 1859. Horrified by the sight of the casualties, he organised local women and boys to give assistance to the wounded of both armies. He set up an emergency hospital in a church.

Later he related his experiences in a book, and went on to organise a committee in 1863 and this led to an international conference in Geneva after which relief societies were formed nationally.

Henri Dunant worked tirelessly in this field, leading eventually to his bankruptcy and disgrace. Eventually he was rehabilitated and became, in 1901, the recipient of the first Nobel Peace Prize.

Anne is principally concerned with Patient Transport, organised to take patients to medical appointments in Bendigo or further afield in Melbourne. The people in this group, like Anne, do not simply pick-up at one door and set down at another, they escort the patients into the hospital and stay in attendance through the medical procedure.

Red Cross is a purely voluntary organisation, it does not advertise and relies for financial support, on the public.

I will seek the approval of the Club's Membership to adopt changes to the Club's constitution to read as follows:

CHANGE NUMBER ONE:

Paragraph 17. Subscriptions:

Presently reads:

"Members of the Club shall pay an annual subscription as determined by the Annual General Meeting".

(Proposed change to add the following sentence)

"The subscription shall include such capitation and insurance fees as may be required by the Probus Centre - South Pacific Inc".

CHANGE NUMBER TWO:

Paragraph 23. Rules:

Presently reads:

"The club shall adopt such rules not inconsistent with the requirements as set out in this resolution and as required under the associations incorporation act, embodying additional provisions for the management of the club. Such rules may be amended from time to time as provided therein".

(Proposed change to read as follows)

Paragraph 23. By-Laws:

"The Club shall adopt by-laws not inconsistent with the constitution, embodying additional provisions for the management of this club. Such by-laws shall be amended from time to time as provided therein".
