John Higgs a Director from the Bendigo Art Gallery was the guest speaker at the April meeting and was introduced to the members by President Ern Holland. John spoke about how the Gallery had grown since it's beginning in July 1887 at the school of mines, moving to View Street in 1890. The most significant change was amalgamation with the City Of Bendigo Council. Forward planning of exhibitions was most important, E.G. The Golden Age of Couture was two years in negotiations, and attracted about 80,000 visitors also a lot of money into our economy, another large draw card was the Archibald Exhibition which attracted 40,000 visitors in one month, the latest Archibald Exhibition will be in Bendigo Art Gallery in the coming months. John concluded by saying the Art Gallery has 1,400 members, plus volunteers and any new members would be most welcome. After answering many questions from members, Bryan Clemson thanked John and made the usual presentation.

Thomas "Tom" Albert Roberts O.A.M. Foundation Member

Tom was born in Melbourne in 1921 and spent his early formative years in Seddon, he attended Yarraville West Primary School and spent his middle school years at Footscray Institute Of Technology. After six years at Footscray Institute, achieving Dux in his final year, he then proceeded to Melbourne University gaining his Batchelor of Engineering Science, he had already completed a Diploma Of Mechanical Engineering and Electrical Engineering. In 1941 he joined the Department Of Supply as a cadet engineer at the Footscray Ammunition Factory, during his time there he was sent to London for 18months and Washington for six months. Tom moved to Bendigo in 1974 to manage the Ordance Factory, prior to this he was the manager



of Port Melbourne Engine Works from 1961. Tom retired in 1985, and took up restoring antique furniture and dabbled with oil painting. He was the proud recipient of the Order Of Australia in 1985.
