The subject will be "The Bendigo Turntable Company"

President Ern Holland welcomed and introduced Don Challenger to the members. Don joined the British Army and served for some 22 years reaching the rank of Warrant Officer and had attachments to Infantry, Tank Corps and Airborne however he centred his talk on his experiences with the Gurkha Rifles attached to the British Army with whom he served in Hong Kong and Malaysia mainly. The origins of Gurkha service with the British crown go back to the Anglo Nepal war of 1814-16. Mutual respect grew from this conflict, and very soon Gurkhas were enlisted for service in the Army of the East India Company. Their first conflict was the Pindaree War in 1817, and this was followed by a succession of campaigns in which the reputation of the Gurkhas grew from strength to strength.

The Royal Gurkha Rifles was formed on 1 July 1994, after amalgamation of four Gurkha Regiments, 2 GR, 6 GR, 7 GR and 10 GR. All Gurkha soldiers are recruited in Nepal annually mainly from very poor young men whose age has to be guessed! The Royal Gurkha Regiment currently have a jungle role Battalion permanently based in Brunei and a Light Role Battalion in the UK. Out of 28,000 applicants last year, only 230 soldiers were enlisted. All Officers (British) are expected to speak Nepali and will attend a language course in Nepal. Don highlighted his talk with a slide show depicting the sacrifice of goats and water buffalos by the soldiers many of whom dressed as women so that dancing could take place!

RECIPE FOR THE MONTH OF MAY

The description is a bit long winded, but the method is basically very simple, so come on chaps get the apron on and treat yourself and partner and / or family !

Equipment

Large heavy based saucepan

Ingredients.

1 1/2 cups of Long grain Rice

500gm mince.

Oil

1 onion finely diced

1 carrot diced to your liking.

1 packet, chicken noodle soup mix.

1 cup of hot water

1/2 medium wombuk (Chinese cabbage), finely sliced.

2 tbs curry powder (I use "Clive of India" brand)

salt n pepper to taste

Method

Cook the rice using your preferred method and set aside (do not over-cook). I use the absorption method.

Add oil to pan and cook mince on med high heat until browned, breaking up any chunks until all mince is a fine consistency.

Added 1 tbs of curry powder and stir in thoroughly for a minute or two.

Remove meat from pan and set aside.

In the same pan add the diced carrot and onion and cook until the onion is soft / translucent.

Turn the heat down and add 1 tbs of curry powder, mix in well for about a minute. It will tend to stick to the base so keep stirring/ scraping.

Add chicken noodle soup mix and a cup of hot water, stirring well to combine.

Return the cooked mince to the pan, stir in well. Simmer for 2-3 minutes.

Check moisture level. Add a splash of water as required. This is needed to steam the cabbage.

Add the cabbage and mix in well. Turn down heat, cover pan with lid and simmer to 5-10 minutes.

Check the cabbage is cooked to you liking. Simmer some more if still too crisp. Add more water if required. Just enough to allow steaming and prevent sticking and burning.

Check for seasoning as you go. Add salt and pepper as required or even some more curry powder.

At this point you want most of the water to have been steamed away.

Finally, stir in the rice. Mix it in well. Once the rice grains have taken on a yellow color, you are ready to eat.

Serve with crusty bread and a wine or two of your choice.

Should serve about 4 to 5 depending on second helpings.
