Our guest speaker today will be Colin Fowler who will speak on the Submarine Service.

The speaker at last month's meeting was the Mayor of Greater Bendigo, Willie Carney. She was introduced by Brian Clemson.

In his introduction Brian gave a summary of Willie's life before Bendigo and up to the time that she became involved in Council activities.

Willie spoke of her decision to stand for council, encouraged by her husband, but she would not be concerned if she was not elected. She was successful and, in due course, put up her hand for the mayoral position. Again being successful, but in the second round, she was voted into Office.

On one occasion Willie had not been briefed properly on a meeting with Professor Fells from the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission which resulted in an embarrassment to her. After that she decided that it would not happen again as she would bone up on everything before hand.

The next day Willie was meeting and lunching with the British High Commissioner and, on the following day was on a 'plane headed for Canberra to talk to Senator Robert Hill on the Bushmaster project'. This was not a happy meeting and gave Willie a previously unknown insight into "Pollies". Her return to Bendigo was delayed as flights were behind time and, as this was the night of her installation as Mayor, she was in panic mode but, after a quick change, she made it.

In answering some complaints that the council favoured the inner city, Willie made mention of some of the work being undertaken in some of the outlying areas.

Bendigo is growing at the rate of 1000 people per annum and is becoming the retirement centre for retirees in the middle and upper income brackets.

Willie spoke of the committees to which she belongs, the meetings she attends, the functions she has opened and the loyal support she receives from her husband and from the staff on the council.

In reply to a question on the three tiers of government, Willie was very much in favour of a two tier system, i.e. remove State Governments and develop Regional Governments with the Federal Government.

Our President, Barry O'Brien, thanked the speaker and made the usual presentation.

REPORT ON LOCAL INDUSTRIES TRIP (Tuesday 8th October)

A group of 22 Probians and wives had a very interesting afternoon.

First visit was to the Bendigo Advertiser Print Works in Beischer St. where we were given a conducted tour of the Complex and shown over the complete operation for preparation and printing.

At present 2 shifts Day/Night are worked, 16 hrs, may go to 24 hrs. The complex prints newspapers for the Bendigo Advertiser, Wimmera Mail Times, St. Arnaud, Cranbourne and Berwick. Copy for each paper is received electonically by Microwave Link and processed by computers at the complex. A combined total of approximately 185,000 sets of newspapers are printed daily by a staff of 7. Printing with colour is carried out by 16 units of "State of the Art" printing presses set up in two banks of eight.

As total numbers were limited at Rositas and Australian Defence Apparel, President Barry accompanied a group to A.D.A. and Arthur to Rositas.

ROSITAS: A 12 year old food industry in Bendigo employs a staff of 100 and work is carried out 24 hrs per day, 5 days per week. It produces both corn and flour based products, the raw materials are all Australian.

The main products produced are:

TACHOS: or retail and speciality shops.

TORTILLAS: (a flour based product for wrapping food). These are sent to locations all over Australia for K.F.C. and MacDonalds and are exported to Malaysia and South Africa.

CORN CHIPS: Are also produced in both Risoto and Home brands.

We were conducted over the production operations by Project Engineer Greg Atkinson detailing each process from the raw material to finished products.

A most interesting and informative visit to such a vibrant local industry with dedicated staff with their sights set firmly on increasing their market share both in Australia and overseas.

AUSTRALIAN DEFENCE APPAREL: We were divided into two groups for a bright and most informative tour of the complex.

A.D.A. commenced in Bendigo in 1988 and now employs 180 staff, (140 machinists, 30 support and Administrative Staff).

A.D.A. manufactures for our services, B.P. Aust., B.P. Oil, AAMI etc, in all for 33 companies. It also supplies a number of companies "Corporate Wardrobes".

We observed computerised cutting machines which cut 100 garments per movement. 40 cutters would be required for the same amount of work. Bullet-proof vests are currently being made for the Victorian Police Force and are very heavy. The ceramic base is moulded to the chest, then covered many times in a special fabric which reduces the velocity of a spinning bullet or the blade of a knife.

We observed a line of machinists sewing a service persons shirt to completion — taking in all 3 minutes, including packaging.
