This month's guest speaker is Mrs Nora Stubbs of R.A.C.V. who will speak on The Royal Automobile Club of Victoria.

The guest speaker, Mrs Judith Doughty was introduced by Allan Dingle. She is the C.E.O. at Strath-Haven.

Judith was born on a farm at Holbrook in N.S.W., went to school in Albury and initially trained as a teacher. She worked for many years with children, teenagers and adults with disabilities and their families in Victoria, NSW and recently in the UK.

She has a Bachelor of Arts (Psychology), a Diploma of Education, a Graduate Diploma in Special Education and is currently completing a Masters in Human Services Management.

On their return from 2 years working in the UK in 2000, Judith and her husband David who works at the Bendigo Bank moved to Bendigo where they live on 6 acres at Strathfieldsaye.

Judith has been CEO at Strath-Haven for 3 years; a position she enjoys enormously.

Our speaker commenced her talk by inviting members to give suggestions as to what people approaching retirement might be looking for. Suggestions put forward included, staying as long as possible in their own homes, availability of supporting services as these become necessary, company of others, maintaining their interests and activities, living in close proximity to or having ready access to general services, shopping, etc, and maybe eventual accommodation in Hostel or Nursing Homes if deemed necessary.

The suggestions were very much in line with those anticipating by our speaker and also in accordance with a major study "Vision 20/20" initiated by messers Bailleu Myer and Arvy Parblo several years ago.

To illustrate the various levels of accommodation available in Bendigo she mentioned Bendigo Village as independent living, Strath-Haven as low care accommodation and Carshalton House as high care accommodation.

Our speaker then went on to tell us of the great increase in the number of retirees aged 65 that had occurred over past years, and compared that with the rapidly increasing number of people retiring nowadays, including many before the age of 65, and the changing attitudes of different generations. In 2001, 12.7% of the population were over 65 and it is anticipated that by 2031 that number will be 21%.

Prior to about 1946 many people had experienced the depression, there was a high rate of unemployment, people were loyal to their employers and worked hard to achieve what they wanted. The y ears, 46 to 64, often referred to as they years of the Baby-Boomers, were years of re-building, people were better educated and there was little un-employment. The years 65 to 80 saw rapid increases in technology and a tendency to achieve things quickly. The following period, 80 to 95, saw a stronger commitment to the environment; people tended to be more sociable but less loyal to their employers. Consequently, as attitudes have changed over these generational periods so too have expectations changed, and in the case of Strath-Haven, which when designed and opened 25 years ago was adequate in every way, now needs some modifications to the building an in the care of residents. A study of experiences in the lives of residents has resulted in, among other things, a "Cheeky-Bits" display consisting of black and white, wall mounted photographs of residents with a brief note of some of the most interesting aspects of their lives. To illustrate this our speaker displayed one of these, a very nice photo of Allan and Thelma Dingle with the attached summary of their earlier lives.

Alan Court thanked our speaker for her very interesting talk and made the usual presentation.
