PAST 2 PRESENT

I am often asked, especially when meeting someone for the first time that having been a Jockey, do I now follow the horses, i.e. have a bet, the answer is no, the reason is as follows.

I lived and served my apprenticeship in Palmerston North in the Manawatu district of New Zealand. The Manawatu Racing Club held a three day meeting over the Christmas period at that time. Just prior to this meeting one morning during training, a visiting trainer Mr Archie McGregor asked my boss, Eric Temperton (both of whom afterwards trained a Melbourne Cup winner - Even Stevens and Silver Knight). This was in December 1948, I had my first ride in a race in February 1949 - an aside, I was too young and too small at 5 stone and in February 1950 I had my 12th ride.

Back to 1948, Mr McGregor asked my boss if he had someone he could borrow to ride his horse in a training trial, and so it happened I was sent to do this job. The horse I rode was named Rhondayale and in my opinion he worked very well and was to race on the 2nd day of the meeting. I asked (told) my father to come to the race meeting - another aside, I was still going to school at this time and worked every morning and every evening after and received the princely sum (looking back) of fifteen shillings a week, plus found.

As at the time I was not yet riding, I was at the races (2nd day) attending my bosses horses. I had saved some of my wages at this time to buy riding gear, silks, boots and saddles etc. so I went to the races with ten pounds in my pocket for Dad to put on the said Rhondavale in the 7th race.

I was tending our horses and talking to my Dad when over the P.A. system came the news that Rhondavale was scratched. Just after this announcement the club farrier came along to chat to my Father - another aside, Mr Laurie Purton always dressed in a suit, waistcoat with pocket watch chain and sovereign case with two sovereigns and three half sovereigns on the days he was supervising and not actually working.

In the course of his conversation with Mr Purton, my Dad mentioned my bet and that

Rhondayale had been scratched. With that Mr Purton stated, "with him out Whitley would be a certainty" when Mr Purton left my Dad said what are going to do, "put the ten pound on Whitley, five pound each way".

Do you want to know the result, Whitley ran fourth. On the third day of the meeting Rhondavale raced and won and paid eleven pounds for the win, I of course was fresh out, this is my reason for never being keen on the punt.
