I was privileged to be with a group of Probian's who were taken on a conducted tour of the Bendigo Bank last Thursday 20th Oct.
This outstanding building features some first to be incorporated into a place of this type.
Such as, under floor air conditioning brings fresh air through ducts in the floor and the used air leaving through the ceiling.
Automatic blinds combined with the lighting to give the workers the best of light to work with.
Rain water is stored in a 10.000 ltr tank on the roof, this is used to water the plants and gardens, also there is a recycling plant in the ground floor that recycles the black and grey water back to AAA rated water and this is used to flush the toilets, this saves 4.5 million ltr of drinking a year.
When you enter the building the first thing that you notice is the space and the second is that although there 860 people working there, there is silence, it must be a wonderful atmosphere to work in.
At several areas around the work area there are canteens where the staff can make a drink if they wish, and take back to their desk.
There is a big kid's room set with computers so that the children of the people working there can come after school and continue to do their studies.
The Board room is state of the arts set up where the Board members can get together with others all over Australia, via the internet, a great saving in travel.
We all enjoyed the tour, and a nice Chinese lunch to finish off, GREAT!!
Now the next thing we will enjoy is our Christmas lunch, looking forward to seeing you all there, 7th December.

1 Tablespoon mustard sauce.

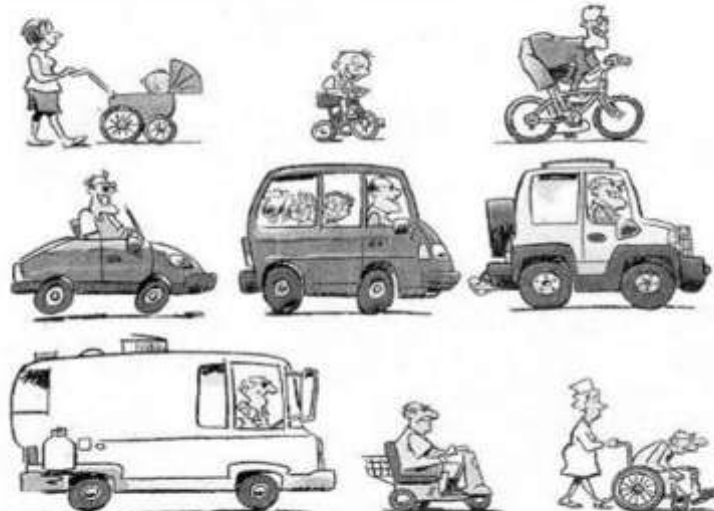
1 Teaspoon sea salt

PRE-EXISTING CONDITIONS WAIVER

The exclusions for pre-existing medical conditions on the PSP Optional Travel Insurance policy has been waived. However, the following conditions still apply:
