The Guest Speaker at the October meeting will be Rob Hunt, the Managing Director of the Bendigo Bank. He will be talking on 'Sustainable Communities'.



GUEST SPEAKER:

Last month's speaker was Geoff Russell. Geoff is a director of the company Media Australia and he was speaking about how they had planned the preparation for the Federation display at what we know as the old Bendigo Post Office, which was originally the New Public Offices, Sandhurst. Because the building is under the National Trust no changes to the structure was allowed, but in the 40's and 50's, a great deal of alteration had occured.

The emphasis in the display is on Bendigo's history, especially where this refers to Federation. An instance of this is a re-creation relating to the ANA hall which stood in View Street, where an important, seminal speech was made by Alfred Deakin. The hall was demolished in the 1960's but reconstruction of some features have been made, one of them a re-creation of the office of Sir John Quick as it was just before his death.

A new stairwell taking a staircase to the basement was constructed. All the stone blocks and the brick removed to make way for this, and other constructions must be stored in the building because they are part of the heritage. The stone was derived from the Harcourt

Quarry.

Geoff showed and explained many photographs taken at all stages of the work and of the formal opening ceremony on Friday August 31st. It is planned that the display will run for at least 3 or 4 years, and probably much of it permanently. The work of construction cost \$1.2 million. In question time Ralph Michell revealed that the family firm had been employed in some of the work in the 1940's and 1950's.

Jim Aitken thanked the speaker and made the usual presentation.




LAST MONTH'S PUNCTUATION TEASER:
