Following in Felix's footsteps

The guest speaker at the August meeting was Felix Cappy who was introduced by Cliff Binks.

Felix was born in Castlemaine and, after studying law at Melbourne University for three years, decided to enter the Real Estate business by joining a Melbourne firm. He then

transferred to the family business at Castlemaine and later expanded the business by taking over Bendigo Real Estate and more recently Canterbury Real Estate in Eaglehawk.

He has always had a desire to travel and has visited more than fifty countries - some more than once. One of the most interesting countries he visited was Cuba and, in particular, Lake Titicaca high up in the Andes Mountains and Fourteen thousand feet above sea level. One must gradually acclimatize oneself by taking a few days to travel to the lake. Incidentally it is approximately at the same latitude as Cooktown.

The Uros tribe lives on the shores of the lake and has used the lake and its products for most of their needs. The Totora reed (similar to Balsa) has many uses, one of them being to create floating islands on which many of the people live. Years ago the Incas tried to over power the Uros, however they retained their independence by floating away on their islands, which can at times measure up to forty by forty metres and house up to thirty people. Each family group could be in a house approximately four metres by two metres and consist of eight or nine people. Each family group has its own grandfather. The numerous grandfathers meet at agreed times to make the rules for the general well being of the community.

The lake has over two hundred varieties of fish and there is abundant bird life. Lake Titicaca is one hundred and eighty kilometres long and up to sixty kilometers wide.

The Uros have a number of crafts and they trade their wares on the shores of the lake. Felix noted that some of the islands had solar panels, which was an indication that they are evidently using some electrical appliances.

There are some schools on the islands, however they are limited because of the life style of the locals.

Many questions were directed to Felix and everybody agreed it was a most interesting session. Bryan Armstrong thanked Felix on our behalf.
