REPORT ON TRIP: Monday 19th Sep't: Dutch Masters N.A.G. Vic. & Federation Square.

Forty Nine Passengers comprising Members of Probus Club of Bendigo & their Partners together with some from other Probus Clubs and friends of Probus, departed Bendigo on time at 7.30am for Melbourne to see the Dutch Masters Exhibition and to visit Federation Square. Prior to departure President Brian welcomed the group, especially those from other Probus Clubs and friends of Probus. Coach Captain was our friend Neville Dewhurst, who as usual was most helpful to all.

Upon arrival at Nat. Gallery of Vic at 9.45am, we were surprised to witness the large que of people already lined up waiting entry to the Gallery for the Dutch Masters, however Arthur, assisted by Faye Himsworth were quick off the mark, payments were made, tickets obtained together with booklets and we were quickly on our way. Many had a light morning tea before commencing their tour of the exhibition which proved to be "an art lovers delight." As previously advised, the exhibition was a most comprehensive display of the amazing works of 17th Century Dutch Masterpieces by the great artists such as Vermeer, Rembrandt, Frans Hals, Pietre de Hooch and Jan Steen, "the cream of one of Europe's greatest collections" the first time in Australia and only to be on display in Melbourne, what a treat!!.

Lunch was taken in the Bistro Area where prior arrangements had been made to reserve seating and for our group to be served at 11.30am. Following lunch, additional time was spent at the Gallery.

On boarding the Coach at 1.30pm Neville very speedily transported us the short distance to Federation Square where we spent the next couple of hours. We first paid a visit to the Centre of the Australian Moving Image Screen Gallery, where to Arthur's dismay, the exhibition had changed to "White Noise" exploring abstraction in the digital age - too much for us to comprehend. However another section proved to be more of interest, where in modules seating four with touch screen control, some early Victorian Films were viewed - a 1958 fishing trip at Malacoota Inlet, Cohuna Township in 1952 and of course - the history of the Bendigo Chinese & Museum. Some visited the Potter Gallery of Australian Art, and others the Australian Racing Museum.

After an enjoyable and informative day we departed for home at 3.30pm and arrived in Bendigo on time at 5.40pm. We enjoyed meeting with and sharing the outing with our friends from other Probus Clubs and friends of Probus. Our thanks to Coach Captain Neville for transportation excellence.
