PROFILE

Our Hon. Auditor namely Ronald Bruce Stanistreet is well qualified to watch over the financial records of our Club, as you will see from his profile.

RONALD BRUCE STANISTREET was born in Bendigo in 1921, the youngest child in a family of four to John Jepson Stanistreet and Maud Stanistreet.

He attended Quarry Hill State School and them to Bendigo High School for 1 year, 1933, before attending Scotch College Melbourne

from 1934 to 1937 to Intermediate Certificate.

Ronald returned to Bendigo and began work in the office at his fathers Accountancy and Legal Managers firm of McColl, Rankin and Stanistreet. He can recall that as Legal Manager, his father was handling the Company Affairs of North Deborah, Central Nell Gwynne, North Virginia and Central Napoleon Goldmining Companies. As a junior, he used to ride his bike around the city to pay the accounts to various suppliers of goods and services used by the Mining Companies.

Ronald also began doing Auditing work assisting Accountants checking vouchers and other items also having to tally up cash

books etc.

In 1941 he joined the A.I.F. and saw service in Victoria, Queensland and Morotai at the time of the Brunei, Balikpapan and Tarakan

Campaigns.

In 1944 he married Zelle Pearce at St. Pauls Church of England Church. Returning home in January 1946, Ronald resumed work at his fathers office obtaining his Accountancy degree in 1954, and became a partner in the firm.

During his working life, he was Honorary Treasurer for the Bendigo Art Gallery, Honorary Auditor for the Bendigo Red Cross, Hon. Secretary for St. Marks Church of England, Golden Square and later

Auditor.

Resigned from the firm in 1974, later doing clerical work for Dick Conroy who later sold the business to Elliott Bros., where

he continued until he retired in 1986.

Ron and Zelle's only son was born in 1957 and brought them great joy. Peter attended Golden Square State and High School prior to going to Monash University where he obtained his Bachelor of Economics Degree. He now lives in Canberra with his wife Carolyn. Ron and Zelle are also the proud grandparents of Caitlin who is 3 years of age.
