AUGUST MEETING GUEST SPEAKER.

Our Guest Speaker for August was to have been Mr. Mark Webster of Goninans, Bendigo, but, as he was unable to attend his place was very ably taken be Mr. Martin Gray. Mr. Gray was introduced by Allan Dingle and spoke of the history and achievements of Goninans in Australia.

The first Goninan to come to Australia arrived here from Cornwall in 1874 and commenced a foundry in Newcastle in 1899. From general foundry work, the firm became a progressive Australian company in the transport field with 18 sites nationally, approximately 2000 employees and specialized in the manufacture and maintenance of rolling stock for the various rail systems of Australia and Asia.

Some of the Goninans achievements include the manufacture of the Sprinter trains, light rail vehicles, for Victoria and Hong Kong, manufacture, and maintenance, of the Tangara

trains for Sydney, equipment for the Western Australian mining industry and the manufacture of diesel/electric locomotives for Thailand.

The lease of the Railway Workshops was obtained in February 1996, with a staff of 119 workers. Some of the problems at takeover included staff problems where the staff were highly skilled but came from a climate of mistrust, uncertainty, poor communications, poor prospects and declining work load. There were also poor practices which were not staff caused. This has now been turned around with a good working environment. In the near future, staff will be able to take part in a share plan. Goninans is now a joint venturer worldwide and has also been helping A.D.I. Bendigo with specialized welders on a recent project.

Mr. Gray was thanked by Arthur Eaton for his interesting and informative talk and was presented with the customary classic probus mug.
