For our August meeting the guest speaker was Mr. Colin Burns, Production Manager for the Bendigo Mining Company, who spoke on mining in Bendigo. Due to the late arrival of Mr. Burns Bob Holmes kindly agreed to share his holiday experience in Fiji.

He enjoyed the luxury of the Fijian Hotel situated right on a palm fringed shore, complete with a bowling green.

Of the population of 1 million, 48% are Indian and the rest Fijians. The Fijians are well spread out around the islands in villages of 3 to 4 hundred people. The Indians tend to take over the businesses in the larger towns.

The Captain Cook cruise takes 120 passengers and visits some of the idyllic islands where the locals entertain the tourists with their dancing and harmonious singing.

Many thanks to Bob for filling in and giving us food for thought when it comes to winter holidays.

Bob also showed us a booklet with comprehensive information of our most prolific flora, the gum tree. Written by our member, Eugene Sandner, it is titled "Know Our Gum Trees", and is available from A.B.C. shops and at stationers.

Our listed guest speaker was introduced by President Kevin. We were told that Colin Burns studied at the Bendigo Institute of Technology and obtained a Diploma in Metallurgy.

Colin outlined a brief history of the Bendigo gold field from when gold was first discovered in 1851. The last mine to close was the now tourist attraction, Central Deborah, in 1954. Bendigo mining produced 9 to 10 times that of Ballarat. Production over the 103 years totalled 6 million ounces alluvial and 17 million ounces of reef gold. It now appears that we are to experience a resurgence in a major operation in reef mining

well below that of previous operations.

Western Mining Corp. spent \$20 million in exploration of the Bendigo field. Bendigo Mining, with a successful rights issue of \$35 million, bought the leases, and all of their data base for \$3 million. The balance to be used to construct a decline over 4 km long and about 5.5m square to accommodate large earth moving equipment. The decline will reach mineralised targets below previous workings.

The start of this mammoth project can be seen in operation at Ham St., Kangaroo Flat. The estimate of the quantity of gold to be produced is 10 million ounces, but it will take 2.5 years for the decline to reach the expected gold bearing rock. It is envisaged rock crushing will take place underground.

Jack Watts thanked Colin Burns for bringing us up to date with mining in Bendigo.
