**The Guest Speaker at today's meeting
is Ray Bertuch who will speak about
Dedicated Video Surveillance.**

At the August meeting the speaker, introduced by Brian Clemson, was Professor Les Kilmartin, Dean and Pro-Vice-Chancellor of La Trobe University, Bendigo Campus. His subject was the "View from the Hill, Retrospective and Prospective".

Professor Kilmartin has found his stay of eight years in Bendigo professionally stimulating. He will soon be leaving to join the Insight Group where he will be 'head hunting' for senior staff in higher education.

Nowadays there are bigger and more intense demands on academics, arising through shortage of finance causing higher work loads. Eight years ago courses were

being excised because of shortage of money. For instance Geology has been relegated from being a course in its own right, to being an element in a science course.

Bendigo now has many overseas activities in Asia, in Europe and elsewhere.

However the majority of students are from regional Victoria. Many are mature students pursuing part-time courses who would not be able to study in Melbourne.

Bendigo has a Regional Advisory Board with members from outside the University. This is in contrast to the metropolitan Universities. As a consequence, Bendigo is well linked with the community.

As to academic development, new programmes are needed, to this end the Pharmacy degree was started four years ago. This was possible because Bendigo, being a Faculty, has a degree of autonomy.

Professor Kilmartin was thanked by Rupert Reynolds for an interesting talk and received the usual momento in the form of a Probus mug.

The passing of Ray Downey leaves an empty space in our Club, and in the Probus movement in Bendigo, which will not easily be filled. Ray had a large part in the initial formation of our club, he was the Foundation President in 1985-86, our first year. Later as secretary and committee man, he continued his service.
