This month's guest speaker is Philip Hogan who will talk about Air Ambulance in Victoria.

Last month we had two guest speakers, Sue and Ian Robinson. Their subject was Balloon Flights. Sue and Ian are the operators of "Balloon Flights of Bendigo". Ian is the pilot, with 20 years experience, he is one of the most highly trained balloonists in the country. Sue drives the retrieval vehicle and assists in rigging the balloon and packing at the end.

Sue spoke first and gave us some of the history of ballooning. The Montgolfier brothers of France were paper manufacturers who made a balloon of linen lined with paper. With a fire of straw and rags filling the balloon with smoke and hot air the balloon reached a height of 6000 feet, but it carried no passengers or other load.

Later they put up a balloon carrying a sheep, a duck and a rooster, which all survived the trip. Eventually human passengers flew, two French noblemen, who reached a height of 3000 feet and alighted 5 miles away after a 25 minute flight, landing safely.

The Montgolfiers thought that smoke was the lifting agent but it was later realised that hot air gave the lift.

A balloon has three components, basket, burner frame and envelope. Wicker baskets are still used for standard flights because they are more able to stand up to the shocks of landing. Ian then took up the speaking, talking about the technicalities of ballooning. Usually take off is early in the morning because the air is more stable then because of inversion.

Before take-off weather information is received from the Aeronautical section of the weather bureau. Balloons are defined as aircraft and must meet all the statutory requirements imposed by the Civil Aviation Safety authority. For this reason they must carry VHF and UHF radios,

as well as global positioning system units and mobile phones. They also have altimeters and variometers.

A very interesting presentation by the Robinsons. Bob Chenery presented our thanks and the presentation mugs.
