Report on Trip to Melbourne Wed. 24th August, 2005 to see The Lion King Stage Show

Forty Five Passengers comprising Members of Probus Club of Bendigo & their Partners together with some from other Probus Clubs and friends of Probus, departed Bendigo on time at 9.00am Wed 24/8/05 for Melbourne to see the Lion King. Prior to departure President Bryan welcomed the group. Coach Captain was our friend Neville Dewhurst, who as usual was most helpful to all.

During the trip to Melbourne the Group were briefed on the availability and whereabouts of a number of nearby "Food Marts" with much variety of foods to choose from and situated close by the Regent Theatre. On arrival at the Regent, many in the group chose these, whilst some had lunch in the nearby City Square.

At 12.30pm, among a huge crowd of people we entered the Dress Circle foyer and after a short wait into the Theatre. What a delight to see the fully restored Regent Theatre and its ornate decorative layout.

At 1.00pm the show commenced, what a spectacular show it was, "The Lion King" an award winning Broadway Musical unalike anything seen before, lived up to all the accolades it had always received.

It was set against the majesty of the Serengeti Plains and pulsating with the evocative rhythms of South Africa. From beginning to end of the show it was truly spectacular in all respects of: the portrayal by the cast of the animals of South Africa, the music, colour, costuming, lighting effects, sets, sets changing and stage production, a show which continually delighted the audience.

At the end of the show at 3.40pm, exit from the Theatre was somewhat slow. It was surprising to see the number of Tour Coaches that were lined up outside, some from as far as Swan Hill, we had to wait our turn, departing at 4.30pm and arrived in Bendigo at approx 6.40pm. "A memorable day out."
