Final Episode of this journey.

Hi Family & Friends, For the second year in succession Birdsville was again slipping away in our rear vision mirror. After 150 kilometres towards Windorah and dozens of muddy crossings, we drove a kilometre or so off road to spend the night where last year Barn owls used our roof to launch attacks on native rats that were in plague numbers. This year rats were nowhere to be seen but to our surprise budgies in vast numbers remained feeding in patches of sparse dry grass on red gibber stone. Only fifty metres away and close to timber lining a dry creek, no less than a thousand Black tailed Native hens also accepted the intrusion of our vehicle. Cameras went into overdrive from windows on both sides as these busy birds continued feeding over an area of about 100 metres either side of our motor home. Surprised to find these birds in such an arid environment, our bird book indicated such happenings involving large numbers was a common happening for this specie. After a freezing cold night, daylight revealed the Native hens had left the scene but Budgies, Black faced Wood swallows and a couple of grey nomads remained to soak up the warmth of a rising sun. Because the Cordillo Downs road was still closed as a result of earlier rain, we headed south towards Innamincka via Nappa Merrie Station where we were held up for several hours behind a couple of road trains of cattle deeply bogged in wet sand. Because we were not carrying a long steel rope a road grader was radioed for to haul them to solid ground. On our arrival in Innamincka we found the causeway was just reappearing from a very muddy Cooper Creek, so muddy in fact few water birds were seen because they were unable to detect fish. We turned our attention to Budgerigars nesting freely in the hollows of Coolibah trees lining the banks of the Creek. The results of some enjoyable days there may be mailed later. After leaving Innamincka we travelled 180 kilometres south via Moomba on the well formed Strezleckie Track, before turning east toward Cameron Corner where SA meets NSW and QLD. On reaching Merty Merty Station a patch between sand hills offered us a mass of red and yellow Eremophilas in full bloom. Nearby budgies nesting in stunted Coolibahs beside a massive red sand dune gave us a memorable camp site for a couple of days, where a near full moon rising over sand hills was icing on an already large cake. After crossing hundreds of sand hills to reach the Cameron Corner Store, the genial owners offered us free camping, providing a few dollars were darted onto the ceiling of the bar as a donation for the Royal Flying Doctor Service. Next day as we passed through the adjacent Dog Fence gate, kangaroos and emus were immediately seen and in strong numbers. After a long stretch of road beyond Tibooburra, the traffic lights and roundabouts of Broken Hill seemed like Melbourne or Sydney after our stay in the back country. The multitude of galleries and coffee shops were relished as we did our bit to support local industry. Then it was onward to Bendigo to welcome back Alaskan friends Pat and Irm who had been seeing a large slice of Eastern Aussie for four plus months travelling in our 4wd Nissan X Trail. Our immediate tasks include visiting opticians, GPs, dentists, oncologists and if we remember, memory training lessons. Thanks to all who kept in touch by email and phone. With the call of natural places still loud in our ears, we may head off again soon . Fond regards to all, Rob & Cynthia.



Member Profile of Hugh Ward (Our Elder Statesman) (Reprint from Probe August 2009)

I was brought up in what was a new suburb of Melbourne - Glen Iris. I attended a newly built school – Gardiner Central which went to the 8th grade (now year 8). I then attended Melbourne High School from 1930 to 1933 to leaving certificate. It was the middle of the Great Depression and I had several clerical jobs and to my great delight I was successful in obtaining a job with the Metropolitan Gas Company at the West Melbourne Workshop in the production office. In 1939 when War was declared I was posted to Fort Queenscliff 34th Fortress Engineers with whom I had been a peace time member. After two years at Queenscliff I was sent to Milne Bay, New Guinea and spent two years on coast patrol between East Cape and Buna. My small unit of 21 men was down to 12 in 1943 due to health problems. I returned to Sydney in 1944 where I was discharged. I was married just prior to my move north in 1942. My wife Phyll joined the AWAS and was still in the army in Sydney when I was discharged. We returned to Melbourne early 1945 and lived with in-laws. I decided on a career in Gas Manufacturing and was granted a cadetship to finally become a shift Superintendent. But it took 4 long years to obtain a Diploma in Mechanical Engineering - a prerequisite to the shift superintendent job. In 1948 I was able to fulfill my objective - a most interesting and responsible job to ensure sufficient gas was produced to the city and suburbs of Melbourne which varied according to the weather from day to day. My next move was to that of manager of the South Melbourne works about 1/4 size of West Melbourne works and it was day work. With the advent of natural gas South Melbourne was closed down and I returned to West Melbourne as Assistant Works Manager. In 1958 the Chief Secretary of the John Cain Government Bill Galvin persuaded the Gas and Fuel Corporation to advise on the condition of the failing gas industry in Bendigo. I was then asked to come to Bendigo to prepare a report as to improving the gas supply. The cost to improve the supply was beyond the means of the Bendigo Gas Company so the Government prevailed on the Corporation to reluctantly take over the Gas Company. I was asked to manage the Company for about 6 months on loan. At the end of 6 months there was so much still to be done, I was appointed manager and I brought my family, wife and 4 children to Bendigo. It was a big upheaval for my family as we had just gone into a new home in North Balwyn. When I had the opportunity to return to Melbourne, Bendigo seemed to be a city on the move and I made the decision to remain here – it proved to be a great place to bring up my family. I have no regrets and became involved with membership of Legacy, Rotary, Bendigo Home and Hospital Board of Management, School Committees and the Yacht Club. These have been fulfilling and worthwhile causes and of course in retirement as a member of the Probus Club.
